INDIA SETS NEW RECORD FOR CRUDE OIL IMPORTS IN JANUARY AMID GLOBAL SHIPPING CRISIS

India's crude oil imports soared to unprecedented levels in January, hitting a monthly record, as revealed by data from trade sources.

This surge was attributed to the repercussions of the Red Sea shipping crisis, which caused delays in the arrival of cargoes from the Americas in December.

The world's third-largest oil importer and consumer, India, also marked a significant event in January by receiving its first cargo of Venezuelan oil in over three years.

According to the data, India's oil imports reached 5.24 million barrels per day (bpd) in January, representing a notable 17 per cent increase from December and a 3.5 per cent rise compared to the same period last year.



The trade estimates exceeded preliminary data released by the oil ministry, indicating India's January oil imports at a 21-month high of 21.39 million metric tons (5.1 million bpd).

Explaining the delays, LSEG analyst Ehsan UI Haq highlighted that certain U.S. and Latin American oil cargoes were diverted due to the Red Sea crisis, resulting in their arrival in late December or January.

TEXTILE MINISTRY EYES RS 95,000 CRORE Investments, AIMS for 2.25 million Jobs

The Ministry of Textiles aims secure investments totaling Rs 95,000 crore, projecting the creation of approximately 2.25 million job opportunities within the next 4–6 years, as revealed by a senior government official.





Textiles Secretary, Rachna Shah, outlined the ministry's expectations, anticipating Rs 25,000 crore investments under the Production Linked Incentive Scheme (PLI) and an additional Rs 70,000 crore investment through the PM Mega Integrated Textile Regions and Apparel (PM-MITRA) park scheme, during a recent interaction.

Under the PLI scheme for the textile sector, which targets man-made fibre (MMF) fabric, MMF apparel, and technical textiles, 250,000 new jobs are foreseen.

Simultaneously, the seven planned PM-MITRA parks are expected to generate direct and indirect employment opportunities for 2 million individuals, Shah added.

This initiative is part of a broader effort, with a total outlay of Rs 1.95 trillion announced in 2021 across 14 sectors, including textiles, to enhance various industries' growth and competitiveness.



Legal Updates

District court rules that it cannot compel arbitration where parties contracted to arbitrate pursuant to now-defunct DIFC LCIA Rules

Plaintiff Baker Hughes Saudi Arabia Co. Ltd. ("Baker Hughes") contracted with Dynamic Industries Saudi Arabia, Ltd. (and other related Dynamic Industries entities named in the case as Defendants (collectively, "Dynamic")) to supply materials, products, and services for an energy project Dynamic was working on in Saudi Arabia. The parties' contract required that disputes, if not otherwise resolved, "shall be referred by either Party to and finally resolved by arbitration under the Arbitration Rules of the DIFC LCIA (the 'Rules') from time to time in force

The DIFC LCIA—the Dubai International Financial Center London Court of International Arbitration—was an arbitration center located in Dubai that applied international rules for arbitration based on those used in the London Court of International Arbitration. However, on September 20, 2021, Dubai enacted "Decree 34 of 2021 Concerning the Dubai International Arbitration Centre," in which it abolished the DIFC LCIA and replaced it with the Dubai International Arbitration Centre ("DIAC").

Thereafter, Baker Hughes filed suit against Dynamic in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana, in New Orleans, alleging damages of \$1.355 million for unpaid services. Dynamic moved to dismiss the claims on the ground of forum non conveniens, and in the alternative, moved to compel arbitration. In opposition, Baker Hughes argued that the arbitration provision was unenforceable, because the selected forum, the DIFC LCIA, no longer existed.

Dynamic argued that, nevertheless, Baker Hughes should be compelled to arbitrate its claims in the DIAC, since the abolition decree not only transferred the assets, rights, and obligations of the DIFC LCIA to the DIAC, but also expressly stated that DIFC-LCIA arbitration agreements remained valid. The court found, however, that neither it nor the Dubai government had the authority to unilaterally change the arbitration forum agreed to by the parties.

NEPAL WANTS EASY ACCESS TO INDIAN MARKET TO EXPORT IN BULK AND ON LONG-TERM BASIS

The Nepal government on Friday said it wants to export tomatoes in bulk and on a long-term basis to India but for that, it needs to have easy access to the market and other necessary facilities.




Rs 242 per kg on Friday amid supply disruptions caused by heavy rains. Nepal is desirous to

Arrangements are yet to be made for large scale export of tomatoes, she added.


