INDIAN PHARMA EXPORTS SURGE 8.2%, CROSS USD 20 BILLION

Pharmaceutical exports from India saw a notable surge, growing by 8.2 percent in the period from April to December 2023, reaching USD 20.40 billion, compared to USD 18.85 billion in the same period the previous year.

R. Uday Bhaskar, Director-General of Pharmaceuticals Export Promotion Council (Pharmexcil), attributed this growth to various factors, including a substantial increase in exports to the US by 11.5 percent, which consequently elevated overall exports to NAFTA countries (USA, Canada, and Mexico) by 10.4 percent, reported businessline.

Formulations retained their position as the largest contributor to exports, constituting approximately 73 percent of the total.



Exports to the UK increased by 20.5%, while the WANA region also grew. However, there's a decline in exports to Russia, prompting efforts to revive them. Projections suggest FY24 exports may exceed USD 28 billion, up from USD 25.3 billion in FY23. NAFTA, Europe, and Africa are top regions for Indian pharmaceutical exports. The sector shows resilience and growth due to strong export performance and market diversification.

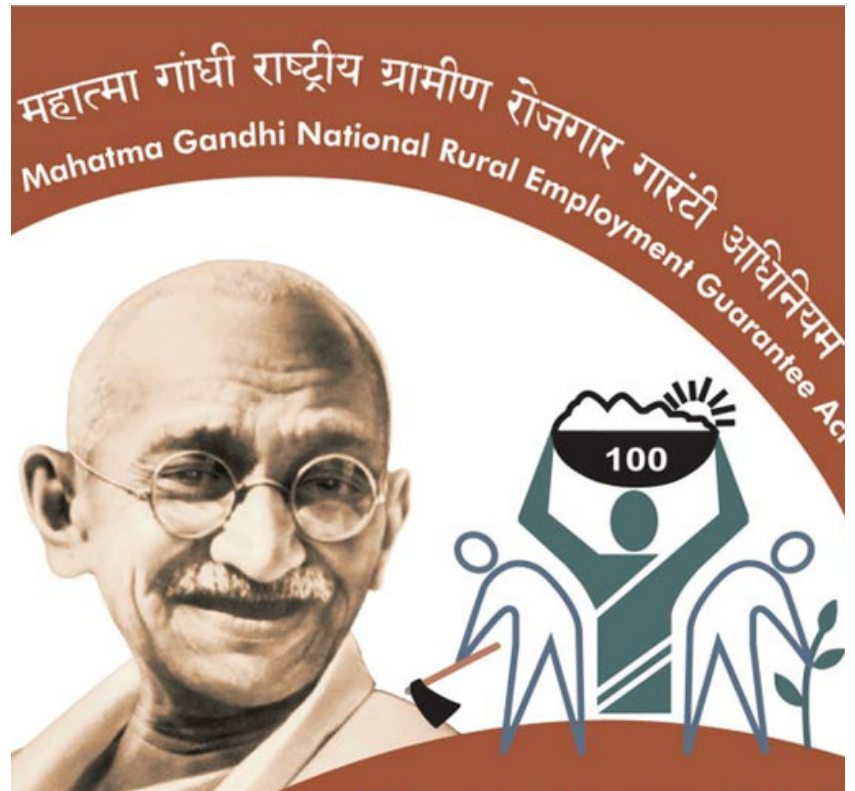

GOVT SEEKS APPROVAL FOR ADDITIONAL SPENDING FOR MGNREGA & OTHER SUBSIDIES

The government is seeking parliamentary approval for a significant increase in spending, totalling Rs 78,673 crore in the current financial year.

This allocation includes Rs 10,798 crore earmarked for the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA). An additional spending of Rs 9,231 crore and Rs 3,000 crore is also proposed for food and fertilizer subsidies, respectively.



Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented the second batch of supplementary demands for grants for 2023-24 in Parliament on Monday.

The supplementary demands encompass a gross additional spending exceeding Rs 2 lakh crore, which is set to be balanced by savings of over Rs 1.21 lakh crore. As per the proposal, the net cash outflow is expected to aggregate to Rs 78,672.92 crore.

The Interim Budget for 2024-25 allocates Rs 44.90 lakh crore for total expenditure, with notable allocations including Rs 9,162 crore for defense services payments, Rs 3,890 crore for defense pensions, Rs 5,000 crore for the Department of Economic Affairs, and Rs 84.12 crore for the Enforcement Directorate's establishment-related expenses due to increased operational activities.

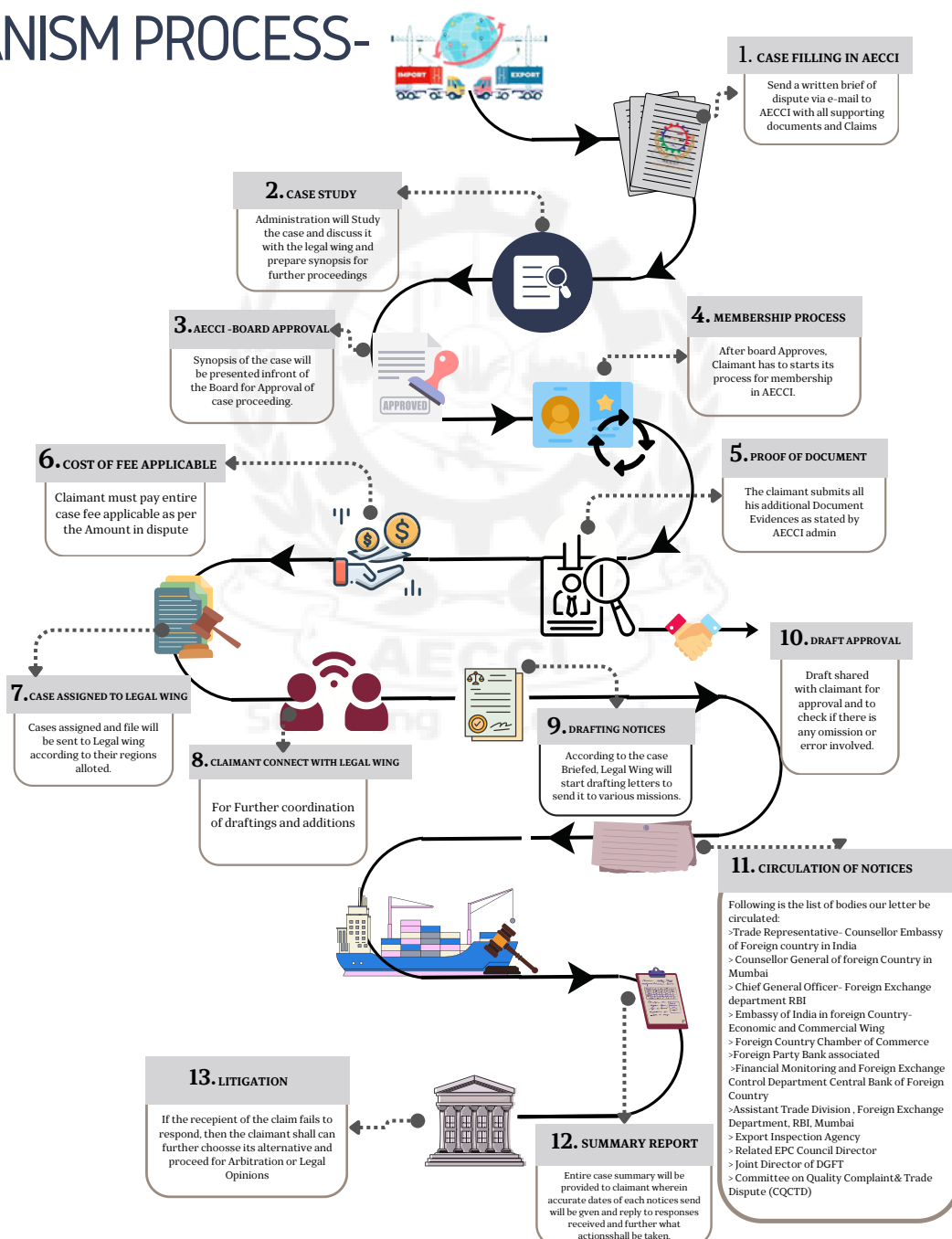

DISPUTE RESOLUTION MECHANISM PROCESS-STEP-1



District court rules that it cannot compel arbitration where parties contracted to arbitrate pursuant to now-defunct DIFC LCIA Rules

Plaintiff Baker Hughes Saudi Arabia Co. Ltd. (“Baker Hughes”) contracted with Dynamic Industries Saudi Arabia, Ltd. (and other related Dynamic Industries entities named in the case as Defendants (collectively, “Dynamic”)) to supply materials, products, and services for an energy project Dynamic was working on in Saudi Arabia. The parties’ contract required that disputes, if not otherwise resolved, “shall be referred by either Party to and finally resolved by arbitration under the Arbitration Rules of the DIFC LCIA (the ‘Rules’) from time to time in force

The DIFC LCIA—the Dubai International Financial Center London Court of International Arbitration—was an arbitration center located in Dubai that applied international rules for arbitration based on those used in the London Court of International Arbitration. However, on September 20, 2021, Dubai enacted “Decree 34 of 2021 Concerning the Dubai International Arbitration Centre,” in which it abolished the DIFC LCIA and replaced it with the Dubai International Arbitration Centre (“DIAC”).

Thereafter, Baker Hughes filed suit against Dynamic in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana, in New Orleans, alleging damages of \$1.355 million for unpaid services. Dynamic moved to dismiss the claims on the ground of forum non conveniens, and in the alternative, moved to compel arbitration. In opposition, Baker Hughes argued that the arbitration provision was unenforceable, because the selected forum, the DIFC LCIA, no longer existed.

Dynamic argued that, nevertheless, Baker Hughes should be compelled to arbitrate its claims in the DIAC, since the abolition decree not only transferred the assets, rights, and obligations of the DIFC LCIA to the DIAC, but also expressly stated that DIFC-LCIA arbitration agreements remained valid. The court found, however, that neither it nor the Dubai government had the authority to unilaterally change the arbitration forum agreed to by the parties.

NEPAL WANTS EASY ACCESS TO INDIAN MARKET TO EXPORT IN BULK AND ON LONG-TERM BASIS

The Nepal government on Friday said it wants to export tomatoes in bulk and on a long-term basis to India but for that, it needs to have easy access to the market and other necessary facilities.

The neighbouring country's plea came a day after Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman told Parliament that India has started importing tomatoes from Nepal amid a record-high spike in prices in thIndia is importing tomatoes for the first time due to high retail prices which were as high as



Rs 242 per kg on Friday amid supply disruptions caused by heavy rains. Nepal is desirous to export vegetables, such as tomatoes, on a long-term basis to India, but for that India has to provide easy access to its market and other necessary facilities, Agriculture Ministry spokesperson Shabnam Shivakoti told PTI here.

started exporting tomatoes to India through official channels a week ago, it is not in big quantities, she said.

Arrangements are yet to be made for large scale export of tomatoes, she added.

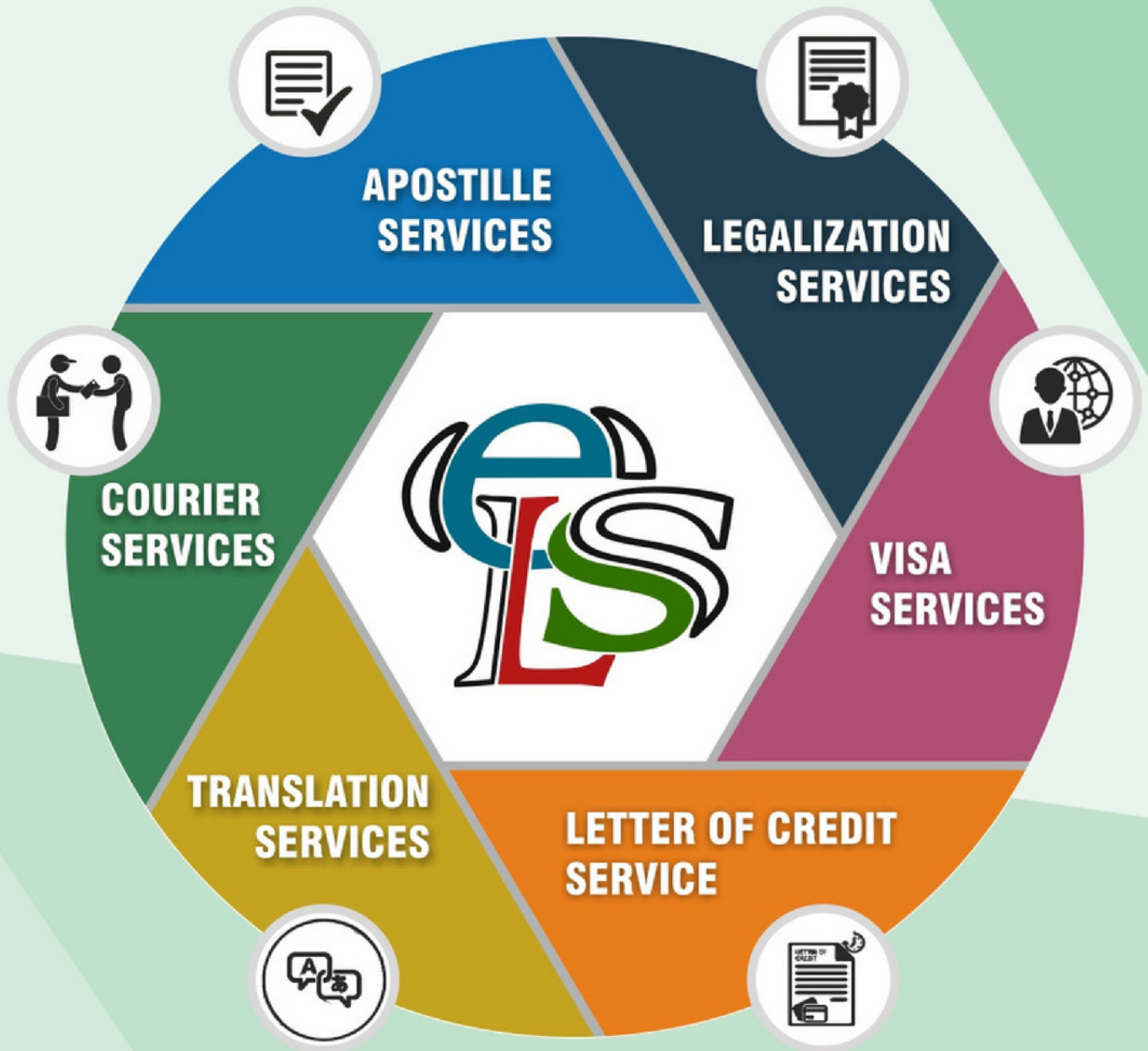
